

What is MVA's Unmet Care Needs Fund?

To help meet the needs of King County veterans who are no longer provided critical gender-affirming care by their VA providers, anonymous donors have partnered with Minority Veterans of America (MVA, Minority Vets) to provide a subsidy for transgender veterans in need of hormone replacement therapy (HRT).

How does it work?

This fund is open to residents of King County, Washington who utilize or are eligible to utilize VA for their healthcare and are denied access to HRT due to federal mandates against the provision of gender-affirming care. Funding will currently be limited to \$500 annually for up to 20 transgender veterans. This fund acts as a stabilization program while veterans find a longer-term solution with MVA's support.

PHASE 2: STABILIZATION

Veterans will work with case managers to find a path to stabilization in care with support from Minority Vets and KCVP.

PHASE 3: SUSTAINABLE SUPPORT

Case Managers will connect Veterans to the state Medicaid options and private insurance.
